Learning Renewal Interim Assessment Reports Reading and Math Scores

- *Reading* and *Math* reports are expected to be accessible in PAN within 48hrs (must be in Complete status to be reported).
- Indicate if students are on track to meet their short- and long-term learning goals.
- Provide an estimated performance level predictive of their summative assessment performance level.
- Provide a within-year growth measure for students.

Learning Renewal Interim Assessment Reports Reading and Math Scores

Reports include overall content area and domain level scores using scale scores.

• The scale score range will be 300-500.

- Report color coding will align with Performance Levels color key shown below.
- Performance Levels color key can be viewed within each report by selecting the **Info** icon.

- Use the <u>IL User Role Matrix</u> posted under Additional Resource on the <u>LRIA Support Page</u> to confirm role and organization level allow report access.

Navigation Tool Enhancements

Status Overview Report Reading and Math

The **Status Overview Report** contains the score and performance levels for each grade/subject at the district and school.



Status Overview Report Details Reading and Math

Select the **Info** icon on the top-right to review information available for each report.

The **Status by Grade** chart shows the score and the number of students that earned that score.

Status Overview Report Details Reading and Math

The **Performance Levels by Grade** graph includes performance level and percentage of students that performed at that level.





The **Status and Growth Summary Report** displays overall score and the domain scores for a group of students on a specific test.

Status Roster Report Details

Reading and Math

The **Status Roster Report** shows a group of student's estimated performance on a single test which includes the subject area and domain scale scores, and standard deviations.

- Report will pull all students registered in a class into one report for teachers.
 - Allows teacher to see a quick summary of their class.



Status Roster Report Details Reading and Math

Level – Estimated performance level for each Student, surrounded with a confidence band.



Status Roster Report Details Reading and Math

When a student is placed in the lowest performance level, the confidence band around the circle reflects the likelihood that the student is placed in the lowest performance level.



The lowest performance level **(Level 1)** will be represented by red circle.



Status Roster Report Details

Reading and Math

When the performance level is one other than the lowest performance level, the confidence band around the circle represents the likelihood that the student is placed in that performance level or above it.



Status Roster Report Details Reading and Math

The circles in the Level column match the performance level colors. The performance levels color bands can be found within each report by clicking on the **Info** icon.

This section uses charts to show the percentage of students estimated to fall within specific performance levels at the grade level. If you click on a grade, you will be able to see a chart for each subgroup of students within that grade.

These are the available performance levels:

- 1. Likely to not meet expectations
- 2. Likely to partially meet expectations
- 3. Likely to approach expectations
- 4. Likely to meet expectations
- 5. Likely to exceed expectations





Score Row – Represents Mean and Standard deviation of all students on class roster for content area and domain.

Status and Growth Report Single Student Status and Growth Report

The **Student Status and Growth Report** shows a single student's scores on a test.

In this example, 3.G.A.1 was initially tested in Interim 1 and then again in Interim 2, and 3. Whereas 3.G.A.2 was first tested in Interim 3.

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Writing Report IL Interim Writing Student Detail Report

The **IL Interim Writing Student Detail Report** provides Student Demographic information, the Overall Student Score, and the score break down for six different Writing Traits.

Writing Traits are scored based on a score range of 1-6 (1 lowest) and (6 highest).



Writing Report Writing Traits

NOTE: An overall score of 0 indicates that the essay could not be accurately evaluated. Please see the explanation at the bottom of the **Student Writing Response Report** for more details.

The individual traits scores are as follows:

Traits Scores	Definitions
Ideas	The extent to which the essay includes a clear main idea as well as appropriately introduced, developed, detailed, and connected supporting ideas.
Organization	The extent to which the essay includes an effective and concise introduction, a skillful conclusion, logical organization, and effective transitions.
Conventions	The extent to which the essay demonstrates control of complex grammatical constructions and is free of spelling, capitalization, punctuation, and grammatical errors.
Sentence Fluency	The extent to which the essay demonstrates control of sophisticated sentence constructions, successful connections between sentences, and variety of sentence beginnings, length, and structure.
Word Choice	The extent to which the essay includes topic-appropriate, precise, mature, vivid, and engaging vocabulary.
Voice	The extent to which the essay displays audience awareness and adopts an appropriate and engaging tone for the topic.
