Braille Edition of the
Grade 5
English Language Arts/Literacy
Practice Test Booklet

General Comments

1. Braille pages are numbered sequentially in the lower right-hand corner. The corresponding print page numbers are in the upper right-hand corner.
2. Some visual cues within a display, which are not necessary to interpret the meaning of the question, are omitted.
3. A Special Symbols page is included to provide the student with information about the dot formation of special braille characters. A Transcriber's Note page is included within the test to explain special format and layout of information.
4. Paragraphs are numbered in braille as they are shown in print.
5. The footers "Go on" are deleted in braille.
6. All references to the answer sheet are omitted in braille. The Answer Sheet is not reproduced in braille.
